Cork or Screw Top?



Recently I've noticed that some of the wines we've ordered in a restaurant have come with a screw top rather than a cork. I must admit, initially I was horrified. To be a good wine, I believed that it must be closed with a cork. I've have since learned otherwise.

Leading the world in searching for a solution to the "corked" wine syndrome, New Zealand has led the world in adopting screw tops for their fine wines. Synthetic corks have been used with moderate success, but there is still a problem with a wine spoiling even with synthetic corks. In addition, they are simply harder to open. Screw tops have been used with great success on \$200 bottles of 200 year old Scotch... Why not wine? The screw top makes a perfect closure for wine. There is no taint. No oxidation. No problems at all. Australia has also jumped on the screw top bandwagon.

Here in the United States, the public opinion used to vehemently support corks. One winery did a test run, bottling a \$150 bottle of wine half in corks, half in screw tops just to get a response. Apparently Americans prefer to avoid the 3 – 5 percent spoilage in wine. The screw top bottles sold out first. Expect to see more and more fine wines available in a screw top version.
